
Fact Sheet: Homelessness in California¹

EXHIBIT 1.7: Estimates of Homeless People By State, 2016



Total Homeless People on a Single Night in January 2016:

- California had 118,142 homeless people, which accounted for 22% of the nation's homeless population. California also had the highest rate of unsheltered people at 66.4% (78,390 were unsheltered).
- California experienced a 2.1% increase in the number of people experiencing homelessness from 2015, but saw a 15% decrease (or 20,844) since 2007.
- Nearly one in five homeless people were located in New York
 City and Los Angeles, however 96% in New York City were
 sheltered compared with 25% in Los Angeles. The top five
 major city continuums of care (CoCs)² with the highest rates
 of unsheltered homelessness were located in California.

Total Homeless Individuals on a Single Night in January 2016:

- California had 97,660 homeless individuals, which accounted for 28% of the nation's population, an increase of 3% from 2015. California had the highest rate of unsheltered homeless individuals at 76% (73,940 were unsheltered).
- California experienced a decline of 12% (13,292) homeless individuals since 2007.
- California possesses 5 of the top 5 major city CoC's with the highest rate of unsheltered homeless individuals.

² Continuums of Care (CoC) are local planning bodies responsible for coordinating the full range of homelessness services in a geographic area, which may cover a city, county, metropolitan area, or an entire state.

Total Homeless Families on a Single Night in January 2016:

- California had 20,482 families with children experiencing homelessness, which accounts for 17% of the state's homeless family population.
- California experienced the largest decrease in homeless families with children from 2015 (9.3% or 2,100), as well as the largest decrease since 2007 (26.9% or 7,552).
- California possesses 4 of the top 5 major city CoC's with the highest rate of unsheltered homeless families with children.

Total Homeless Unaccompanied Children and Youth on a Single Night in January 2016:

- California reported the largest numbers of unaccompanied homeless children and youth, at 11,222 people or 31% of the national total. It also had the second highest rate of unsheltered homeless children at 77.5% (8,691 were unsheltered).
- California also had the largest number of unaccompanied homeless youth who were 18 to 24, and very high rates of unsheltered homeless youth at 78%.
- California possesses the 4 of the top 5 major city CoC's with the highest rate of unaccompanied homeless youth.

Total Homeless Veterans on a Single Night in January 2016:

- California had the largest number of veterans experiencing homelessness at 9,612. Homeless veterans in California represented 24% of the national homeless veteran population. California also had the third highest rate of unsheltered veterans at 58.3% (5,600 were unsheltered).
- Homelessness among veterans had declined most dramatically in California, where the number fell by 1,699 people (15%) since 2015 and 46.5% since 2009.
- California possesses the 4 of the top 5 major city CoC's with the highest rate of veterans homeless.

Total Chronically Homeless on a Single Night in January 2016:

- Thirty-nine percent of the nation's chronically homeless population was located in California, at 29,802. California also had the second highest rate of unsheltered chronically homeless, at 86.9% (25,892 were unsheltered).
- California had the largest increase from 2015 by 624 individuals (2.1%), however California had the largest decrease since 2007 with 10,539 fewer chronically homeless individuals (26.1%) since 2007.
